I. <u>CSCE</u>

ORIGINAL:

The COMMITTEE:

FRENCH

4th September, 1974

invited the International Staff to comply with the suggestion by several delegations to the effect that the Agenda items for the consultations on the CSCE to be held at Council level on 13th September should be worded very broadly.

II. VISIT TO BONN BY THE SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER

The COMMITTEE:

was informed by the German Representative of the visit to be made to Bonn by Mr. Gromyko on 15th and 16th September.

III. SOVIET-RUMANIAN RELATIONS

The COMMITTEE:

took note of a contribution by the German Representative to the analysis of the Soviet Union's current attitude to Rumania, with special reference to the transit through Rumanian territory of military convoys making for Bulgaria.

IV. XVIIITH HALF-YEARLY MEETING WITH DISARMAMENT EXPERTS

The COMMITTEE:

approved the suggestion by the Netherlands Representative that the Agenda for this meeting should comprise an additional item on the Soviet proposal for the prohibition of action to influence the environment for military purposes.
