Note by the Chairman of the Sub-Group on Data Support

GENERAL

This working paper provides an updated display of NATO and Warsaw Pact ground forces data. NATO data is for period end 1974, and WP data for period mid 1975. For ease in handling, the paper is divided into three parts:

- (a) PART 1 (NS). Part 1 is sub-divided into several sections, the first section providing general information concerning data contained in all three parts of the paper and the remaining sections being summaries of data grouped into regions (e.g. the NATO Guidelines Area). The summaries will be published as and when all the required information has been collated for each region.
- (b) PART 2 (CTS). This Part provides detailed data on all NATO ground forces including French ground forces in Western Germany plus forces in the Berlin garrisons. The data on each country are shown in separate sections these being grouped into three geographical regions - the NATO Guidelines Area (including CA, UK and US reinforcements for and foreign stationed forces in Europe); the Northern Flank (DE, NO) and the Southern Flank (GR, IT and TU).
- (c) PART 3 (NS). Part 3 provides detailed data on all Warsaw Pact ground forces by country and by region (e.g. the NATO Guidelines Area, the three Western Military Districts, etc.).

SECURITY

2. Several countries requested that the display of detailed data concerning their respective ground forces be classified CTS, consequently PART 2 is published under separate cover, yet retains the same AC/276 reference and date as the remainder of the paper.

3. To protect the detailed data submitted by countries the distribution of Parts 1, 2 and 3 of this paper is limited to the degree shown in the Distribution List at page 4 of this paper.

4. The security classification of this paper may not be downgraded without the permission of the originator.

REFERENCES

1. Data appearing in this paper were extracted from the following sources:

(a) NATO Ground Forces:

- (1) RFC(WG)WP(70)7, Annex 3, Revised to end 1974;
- (2) Addendum III to DPQs(74);
- (3) SHAPE Order of Battle (Land).

(b) Warsaw Pact Ground Forces:

- (1) MC 224/74(Final);
- (2) MCM-86-74;
- (3) MC 161/75.

DATA FORMATS

2. Data relating to each NATO and Warsaw Pact country's ground forces are shown, where applicable, on three standard formats:

- (a) The Main Format or summary sheet provides total figures of personnel and equipment at all major HQs, in major combat units, non-organic combat support units and in service support units. These are broken down and shown under their respective Commands (i.e. NATO or National). Also shown is the equipment held in reserve and personnel in military security forces.
- (b) Annex A Format provides detailed information of major combat units (divisions and independent brigades/regiments). The NATO divisions in the NATO Guidelines Area (NGA) are further broken down into brigades to give the reader an idea of the differently structured divisions as compared to the Soviet and NSWP division in the NGA which each has four regiments.

- (c) Annex B Format gives a breakdown of the non-organic combat support units by functional type. Military Police (or Provost) and training units are shown as being service support units and are therefore not included in this format.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

3. General. The notes are included for the convenience of the user when studying data contained in the data formats.

- (a) Availability Column. Entries in this column give:
- (1) For NATO Forces - the number of days required for each unit to reach its General Defence Plan Position or reserve area allocated in accordance with MC 55/2 Standards of Readiness and Availability. Information is extracted from each country's RFC(WG)WP(70)7, Annex 3 revised to end 1974.
 - (2) For Warsaw Pact Forces - the number of days required by each unit to reach the state of combat readiness at their peacetime location. Due to lack of NATO agreed intelligence, the Movement time to battle positions is excluded.
- (b) Peacetime Location Column gives the actual town/area in which units are stationed.
- (c) War Authorized Strength (WAS) Column reflects the total planned war authorised strength of the units at the end of the year. Figures shown for Warsaw Pact forces are extracted from present NATO agreed TO&E tables.
- (d) Actual Strength Column
- (1) NATO Forces - shown are the total number of personnel on active duty in units as at the end of the calendar year except for US forces which reflect the peacetime authorized strength. Personnel on courses, undertaking basic training, on temporary duty, on leave and in hospital etc. but charged against unit/formation strength are included.
 - (2) Warsaw Pact Forces - shown are the NATO agreed estimates of active duty personnel based on NATO agreed TO&E tables.
- (e) Main Battle Tanks (MBTs) Column shows the total actual combined number of medium and/or heavy tanks. A number of tanks organic to Artillery and Engineers units are excluded (i.e. OP Tanks, Recovery Tanks, Bulldozer Tanks); where this occurs the fact is footnoted. Tank destroyers as found in the FRG Army are shown as anti-tank weapons.

- (f) Light Tanks and Reece Vehicles Column gives the actual numbers of tracked and wheeled combat vehicles used in command and reece roles.
- (g) APCs Column gives the actual numbers of Armoured Personnel Carriers (tracked, wheeled or half-tracked) in units. These carriers have no fighting capabilities (i.e. no mounted gun of 20 mm or greater calibre) and are intended only for the transportation of troops or cargo on the battlefield.
- (h) Other AFVs Column gives the actual numbers of Armored Fighting Vehicles in units. Included are all remaining types of armoured wheeled or tracked fighting vehicles less carriers mounting mortars, anti-tank weapon systems or flame throwers as these carriers are shown as part of the weapon systems under the appropriate column heading.
- (j) Anti-tank Weapons. These are shown as being the actual number of either:
- (1) towed, carrier mounted or self-propelled anti-tank guns of 50 mm calibre and over and include the FRG tank destroyers; or
 - (2) guided missile launching system - counted by system.
- Hand held weapons are excluded.
- (k) Nuclear Artillery Guns Column gives the actual numbers of artillery guns (tube artillery) that have a nuclear role.
- (l) Dual-Capable Guns gives the actual number of artillery guns (tube artillery) that have a nuclear and conventional artillery capability.
- (m) Other \geq 100 mm Artillery Column gives the numbers of towed or self-propelled artillery guns of 100 mm calibre and over that have a conventional artillery role.
- (n) MRLs (Multiple Rocket Launchers) Column counted by actual launcher system.
- (o) Air Defence Guns Columns give the actual numbers of air defence artillery guns 20 mm calibre or greater that are either radar or non-radar controlled as applicable.
- (p) SAM. Surface-to-Air Missiles are shown as either high or low altitude interceptors and are counted by actual crew-operated launching systems. Individually operated weapon systems such as REDEYE, BLOWPIPE and SA-7 are excluded.

- (q) Mortars ≥ 80 mm Column gives numbers of actual unmounted and carrier/vehicle mounted mortars of 80 mm calibre or over.
- (r) SSM Systems are shown as either:
 - (1) Unguided and Single Rocket Systems (i.e. Honest John, Lance) and are counted by actual launcher systems; or
 - (2) Guided SSMs (Surface-to-Surface Missiles) (i.e. Sergeant, Pershing) and are counted by actual launcher systems.
- (s) River Crossing Systems for MBTs gives the actual numbers of river crossing systems capable of carrying medium tanks either on ferry, floating bridge, or other systems across major river obstacles.
- (t) Fixed Wing (Army Aviation) Column gives the actual numbers of fixed wing aircraft operated by ground forces.
- (u) Helicopters Column gives the actual numbers of helicopters operated by ground forces. Attack, Assault, Recce helicopters are also included.
- (v) Militarized Security Forces. These forces are trained in military tactics, are equipped as a military force and in the event of war are planned to operate as units under the military authority. So far these forces have not been included in totals given to the Ad Hoc Group Vienna as regards NATO and Warsaw Pact ground forces.

GENERAL

2. Part 2 provides detailed data on all NATO ground forces plus French ground forces(1) in the Federal Republic of Germany, as well as forces in the Berlin garrisons. The data on each country are shown in separate sections; these being grouped into three geographical regions - the NATO Guidelines Area (including CA, UK and US reinforcements for and foreign stationed/indigenous forces in the NGA); the Northern Flank (DE and NO) and the Southern Flank (IT and TU).

SECURITY

3. Several countries requested that the display of detailed data concerning their respective ground forces be classified COSMIC TOP SECRET. To retain all data on NATO ground forces in one document it has been necessary to publish Part 2 under separate cover.
