AS AT END 1972Note by the Chairman of the Sub-Group on Data Support

1. General. Attached is a draft display of data covering all NATO countries with ground forces in the NATO Guidelines Area, plus Denmark and all Warsaw Pact ground forces, as at end 1972. The paper is divided into three parts:

- (a) Part 1 - general information.
- (b) Part 2 - data on all NATO ground forces. Each country is shown in a separate section: Sections being grouped into three geographical regions: the Northern Flank, the NATO Guidelines Area and the Southern Flank.
- (c) Part 3 - data on Warsaw Pact ground forces. (This is the only portion of the paper to be revised(1)).

2. NATO Forces. The data shown for the NATO countries included in this paper are not complete. Letters have been sent to the appropriate MOD's requesting the missing information. On receipt of this information, the necessary amendments will be made to the data tables.

3. When using the attached tables, readers should keep in mind that:

- (a) The data shown for Belgium is that for end-1971. On receipt of input from MOD Brussels updating their print-out to end 1972, a new section covering Belgium's ground forces will be published to replace the one included in this paper.
- (b) The data shown for FRG and US ground forces are included as an interim measure until such time as the print-outs for these countries have been updated - this is not expected before mid-October. However, the figures shown for personnel are taken from the latest inputs updating FRG and US forces to end 1972 - beginning 1973. The tank figures were also taken from these same inputs and are accurate for US forces, but additional information is required concerning the 1022 FRG tanks shown as being "Remaining Equipment held".

4. Warsaw Pact Forces. Part 3 gives a revised/up-dated version of Warsaw Pact ground forces as at end 1972. This version is also included as an interim measure. Following the Intelligence Conference to be held in late September, a second revised version of the Warsaw Pact ground forces will be issued to replace the one shown in this paper. The target data for issuing this second revision is 26th October, 1973.

1. The data appearing in this working paper was extracted from information contained in the following documents :

(a) NATO Ground Forces :

- (i) RFC(WG)WP(70)7, Annex 3, Revised to end 1972 ;
- (ii) where inputs have not been received from countries updating the above print-out, data has been extracted from latest national reply to DPQ, or as in the case of Belgium, from the last print-out (as of end 1971).

(b) Warsaw Pact Forces :

- (i) Warsaw Pact Land Forces, Total Listing, RFC(WG)WP(70)2, Annex Revised 1973, dated 14th August, 1973 ;
- (ii) MC 161/73.

DATA FORMATS

2. Data for each country is shown, where applicable, on three standard formats :

- (a) The Main Format provides total figures of personnel and equipment at all Major HQs, Major Combat Units, Non-Organic Combat Support Units and Service Support Formations under command of either NATO or Warsaw Pact, as appropriate, and also for forces remaining under National Command. Also shown is the total equipment remaining in each country not accounted for in above mentioned units/formations.
- (b) Annex A to Main Format provides detailed information on Major Combat Units.
- (c) Annex B to Main Format gives a breakdown of the non-organic Combat Support Units by functional type.

3. General. The notes are included for the convenience of the user.
4. Availability Times. Times given are taken from updated print-outs for NATO forces and from information supplied by the Intelligence Division IMS for Warsaw Pact forces.
5. Personeel. Figures shown for Warsaw Pact forces are based on present NATO agreed TO & E tables. These figures will be amended following any updating of NATO agreed data.
6. Tanks. Figures include medium and heavy tanks and tank destroyers.
7. AFVs, Light Tanks, Recce Vehicles. Figures given do not include weapon carriers such as SP guns, carriers mounting mortars or anti-tank weapons as these carriers are shown as weapon systems under their appropriate weapon column. Figures include both tracked and wheeled combat vehicles.
8. Armoured Personnel Carriers (tracked, wheeled or half-tracked, with no fighting capabilities). Figures shown are for APCs intended only for transportation of troops on the battlefield.
9. Anti-Tank Weapons. These are shown as either :
 - (a) Towed or self-propelled anti-tank guns of 50mm and over, or
 - (b) As guided missile launching systems - counted by system. Hand held weapons are excluded.
10. Artillery - Nuclear Capability. Figures show artillery pieces (towed or self-propelled) capable of delivering either conventional projectiles or nuclear warheads. Since there is no agreed NATO intelligence on the tube artillery nuclear capability of Warsaw Pact forces, nil information has been included on this subject.
11. Other Artillery. Figures shown are towed or self-propelled artillery guns of over 100mm calibre not already included in "nuclear capability" column.
12. Air Defence
 - (a) Guns - Those shown are radar controlled weapon systems of 20mm calibre or over.
 - (b) SAMs - These are shown as either high or low altitude interceptors, and are counted by crew-operated launching systems (so excluding systems such as "Redeye" and "Blowpipe").
13. Mortars. Figures include unmounted and mounted mortars of 80mm or over.

14. Launcher Systems. Counted by launching systems :
- (a) Unguided and Single Rockets - i.e. Honest John ;
 - (b) Guided SSM - i.e. Pershing, Sergeant ;
 - (c) MRL - all calibres of Multiple Rocket Launchers .
15. River Crossing Systems. Figures shown give number of systems capable of carrying MBTs either on ferry, floating bridge or other river crossing system.
16. Army Aviation. Figures give total number of either fixed wing aircraft or helicopter. No distinction has been made between attack, transportation, observation or cargo aircraft.
17. Serials 24 and 28 of the Main Format : "Others (totals)" and "GRAND TOTAL". Totals for these two Serials, where personnel are concerned, were obtained as follows :
- (a) "Grand Total" - from Table II, Item II, Army Section to DPQ ;
 - (b) "Others (totals)" - by subtracting total NATO forces plus total remaining forces from Grand Total.
