Note du président du Sous-groupe sur les besoins de données

1. Généralités. On trouvera ci-joint un projet de modèle de présentation pour les données concernant tous les pays de l'OTAN possédant des forces terrestres dans la zone des directives de l'OTAN, plus le Danemark, et les forces terrestres de tous les pays du Pacte de Varsovie à la fin de 1972. Ce document se divise en trois parties :

- (a) Ire partie - Informations générales
- (b) IIème partie - Données sur toutes les forces terrestres de l'OTAN. Chaque pays fait l'objet d'un chapitre séparé; les chapitres sont groupés en trois régions géographiques : le flanc Nord, la zone des directives de l'OTAN et le flanc Sud.
- (c) IIIème partie - Données sur les forces terrestres du Pacte de Varsovie (seule version du document à avoir été révisée (1)).

2. Forces de l'OTAN. Les données concernant les pays de l'OTAN qui figurent dans le présent document ne sont pas complètes. Les informations qui manquent encore ont été demandées par lettre aux MDN intéressés. Lorsque ces renseignements parviendront, les modifications nécessaires seront apportées aux tableaux.

3. Il conviendra, pour utiliser les tableaux ci-joints, de tenir compte de ce qui suit :

- (a) Les données utilisées pour la Belgique, datent de la fin de 1971. Lorsque le MDN de Bruxelles aura fait parvenir les données mises à jour à la fin de 1972, un nouveau chapitre sera publié pour les forces terrestres de la Belgique et remplacera celui qui figure dans le présent document.
- (b) Les données publiées pour les forces terrestres de la RFA et des Etats-Unis le sont à titre provisoire, en attendant que les tableaux concernant ces pays aient été mis à jour, ce qui ne sera sans doute pas fait avant la mi-octobre. Toutefois, les chiffres mentionnés pour les effectifs sont extraits des dernières informations, mises à jour fin 1972-début 1973, pour les forces de la RFA et des Etats-Unis. Les chiffres donnés pour les chars sont extraits des mêmes données et sont exacts pour les forces américaines, mais des informations complémentaires seront nécessaires au sujet des 1.022 chars de la RFA classés dans la catégorie "autre matériel détenu".

4. Forces du Pacte de Varsovie. La troisième partie contient une version révisée ou mise à jour sur les forces terrestres du Pacte de Varsovie à la fin de 1972. Cette version est également provisoire. Après la conférence du renseignement qui doit se tenir fin septembre, une deuxième version révisée concernant les forces terrestres du Pacte de Varsovie sera publiée et remplacera celle qui figure dans le présent document. La publication de cette deuxième révision est fixée au 26 octobre 1973.

5. Classification de sécurité. Le présent document est classifié Cosmic Très Secret et sa classification ne doit pas être abaissée sans l'autorisation de l'originateur.

PRESENTATION DES DONNEES

2. Les données concernant chaque pays sont, lorsqu'il y a lieu, présentées de trois façons différentes :

(a) Le modèle principal fournit les chiffres totaux d'effectifs et de matériel de tous les grands états-majors, des grandes unités de combat, des

Ce modèle fournit aussi le chiffre total du matériel restant dans chaque pays et non comptabilisé dans les unités ou formations mentionnées ci-dessus.

- (c) L'annexe B du modèle principal donne une répartition des unités de soutien au combat non organiques, par type fonctionnel.

NOTES EXPLICATIVES

3. Généralités. Les notes qui suivent ont été conçues pour faciliter la tâche de l'utilisateur.

4. Délais de disponibilité. Ces délais sont extraits des formulaires mis à jour concernant les forces de l'OTAN et des informations communiquées par la Division "renseignement" de l'EMI sur les forces du Pacte de Varsovie.

5. Effectifs. Les chiffres donnés pour les forces du Pacte de Varsovie ont été établis d'après les tableaux de dotations agréés par l'OTAN. Ces chiffres seront modifiés en cas de mise à jour des données utilisées par l'OTAN.

6. Blindés. Les chiffres qui sont donnés comprennent les chars moyens et lourds et les chasseurs de chars.

7. AIFV, chars légers et véhicules de reconnaissance. Les chiffres mentionnés ne comprennent pas les plates-formes portant un armement comme les canons automoteurs, les plates-formes portant des mortiers ou des armes antichars, étant donné que ces plates-formes sont comptabilisées avec les systèmes d'armes dans la colonne qui leur correspond. Les chiffres mentionnés comprennent les véhicules de combat à chenilles et à roues.

8. Transports de troupes blindés. (à chenilles, à roues ou semi-chenillés, sans moyen de combat). Les chiffres mentionnés concernent uniquement les transports de troupes blindés sur le champ de bataille.

9. Armes antichars. Elles sont comptabilisées :
- (a) ou bien comme canons antichars tractés ou automoteurs, de 50 mm et plus,
  - (b) ou bien comme système de lancement de missiles guidés, groupés par systèmes. Les armes manipulées à la main ne sont pas comprises.
10. Artillerie - Capacité nucléaire. Les chiffres mentionnés comprennent les pièces d'artillerie (tractées ou automotrices) capables de lancer des projectiles classiques ou des ogives nucléaires. Etant donné qu'il n'existe aucun renseignement OTAN accepté par tous, concernant les possibilités nucléaires de l'artillerie à bouche à feu des forces du Pacte de Varsovie, aucune donnée n'a été fournie sur ce point.
11. Autres pièces d'artillerie. Les chiffres mentionnés concernent les pièces d'artillerie tractées ou automotrices de plus de 100 mm non comptabilisées dans la rubrique précédente.
12. Défense aérienne.
- (a) Canons - Il s'agit des systèmes d'armes à contrôle radar de 20 mm ou plus.
  - (b) Missiles surface-air - Catégorie comprenant les missiles d'interception à haute et basse altitude, comptabilisés par systèmes de lancement avec personnel servant (ce qui exclut les systèmes comme le "Redeye" et le "Blowpipe").
13. Mortiers. Les chiffres comprennent les mortiers de 80 mm et plus, montés sur châssis ou non.
14. Systèmes de lancement. Ils comprennent :
- (a) Les fusées non guidées et uniques, comme le Honest John;
  - (b) les missiles surface-surface guidés, comme le Pershing et le Sergeant;
  - (c) les fusées à moyen rayon d'action - lanceurs multiples de tous calibres.
