## II. PARTS OF BASFET III NOT COVERED BY QUESTIONNAIRE

The suggested questionnaire does not cover at all the following sections of Basket III: Meetings among young people 1(f), Sport 1(g), Expansion of Contacts 1(h), Oral information 2(a)(i), Co-operation in the field of Information 2(b), Co-operation and Exchanges in the field of Culture 3, and Co-operation and Exchanges in the field of Education 4. Should the questionnaire cover the whole of Basket III. exhaustively? In particular, should a separate questionnaire be compiled on culture and education?
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
