

## ELEMENT A

VISITS TO NATO HEADQUARTERS AND OUTSIDE LECTURING

During 1976, 11,638 visitors comprising 381 groups were received. They included journalists, TV and Radio correspondents, members of Parliament and prospective Parliamentary candidates, youth and student groups and leaders, university professors, teachers and members of the Armed Forces.

Members of the International Staff and of Delegations addressed audiences in several member countries. Some of these engagements resulted in extensive radio and TV programmes.

YOUTH AND EDUCATION

(Conferences, Seminars and Courses)

There was an increase in the number of seminars and conferences for university students during the course of 1976, 39 different youth activities on NATO, 11 more than the previous year. The explanation may lie partly in the fact that in some member countries students were encouraged to study NATO during their courses.

This office organised a NATO simulation exercise for a group of 70 students based in Belgium and the Netherlands. The students acted both "ambassadorial" and "ministerial" rôles in their day-long meeting. Reports indicated that more schools are interested in taking part in the simulation exercise planned for 1977.

3. PRODUCTION AND PRINTING SCHEDULE (See List on Page D.4)

This schedule reflects the main trend of the 1976 printing programme. It should be noted, however, that since the programme is continuous from one year to another some recording duplication is inevitable, e.g., a major publication like NATO Facts and Figures may be budgeted in one year but not completed and distributed until the next.

4. FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR PUBLICATIONS PRODUCED BY NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS, ETC. (See List on Page D.5)

This list gives details of grants-in-aid given towards the production of publications by various national Atlantic Committees and other Non-Governmental Organizations during 1976. It also lists the purchase by NATIS of national publications deemed useful to the NATO Information effort within member countries. In 1976 this level of support to NGOs represented approximately 45% of the Publications budget and this trend is expected to rise above 50% in 1977.

Financial Support to Non-Governmental Organizations

During 1976, NATIS continued to provide grants-in-aid from the Publications Budget in support of the production and distribution of national publications by Non-Governmental Organizations (such as Atlantic Committees and Defence Associations) in certain member countries. TV - FILMS - RADIO

TV PRODUCTION AND FACILITIES

MINISTERIAL MEETINGS AND OTHER EVENTS

NATIS support during Ministerial meetings and other events included:

1. The use of NATO cameramen in security zones and for interviews during Ministerials of May and December, and DPCs of June and December.
2. Services, film material and/or facilities were provided to forty networks, as well as to Eurovision, Visnews and UPITN.
3. A NATO cameraman covered the December Ministerial in 35 mm for Fox Movietone news distribution in UK theatres.
4. Eleven interviews on film were conducted with NATIS assistance in addition to thirty-seven Norwegian (in May) and twenty-eight Belgian (in December) TV interviews for a combined total air time of some eight hours.

The fifteen NATO countries and twenty-one non-NATO countries received NATO coverage of the above meetings through Eurovision, TV news agencies and networks.

SPECIAL PRODUCTION FOR TV

Four 16 mm colour TV clips were produced in 1976.

The NATIS film library has on hand TV clips on twenty NATO subjects. The usefulness of these clips continues to be amply demonstrated. They allow NATIS to react quickly to TV networks' requests for footage, often on very short notice.

INTERVIEWS FOR TELEVISION

Twenty-nine interviews were conducted in our studios throughout the year with NATO personalities. The Secretary General was interviewed eleven times.

ELEMENT E

FILM PRODUCTION

1. A ten-minute, 35 mm version for theatrical distribution, and a twelve-minute, 16 mm European version of the film "Europe and America", made in 1975 for the Bicentennial market in the United States, were completed in 1976.

NOTE: The twenty-seven-minute, 16 mm original version received the Public Relations Society of America top award for the best public relations film of the year; the CINE "Golden Eagle" award for the best educational film of the year; and the Columbus Film Festival's "Silver Chris" award for the best institutional film of the year. "Europe and America" was in direct competition with more than 400 Bicentennial films. In addition, in Belgium "Europe and America" and "Watch and Ward" received the "Prix Femina".

2. The production of the film "THE GREAT HIGHWAY", on Soviet naval presence and expansion, was completed.

3. The documentary film "THE TEAMWORKERS", on one of NATO's major exercises "Teamwork '76" was produced.

4. A fourth film, "SEARCH FOR SECURITY", was nearing completion.

LANGUAGE VERSIONS OF NATO FILMS

The Danish, Dutch, German, Italian, Norwegian and Turkish versions of "Watch and Ward" were completed in 1976.

French, Dutch and Italian versions of the European version of "Europe and America" were also completed.

Work began on the French and Dutch versions of "The Great Highway" and "The Teamworkers".

COVERAGE FOR NATO FILMS AND FOR THE NATO FILM LIBRARY WAS UNDERTAKEN ON THE FOLLOWING SUBJECTS:

"REFORGER" exercise, both in the USA and in Germany.

AIR TACTICAL WEAPONS MEET, in the Netherlands.

OIL RIGS, in Norway.

STANAVFORLANT, at sea and in the Netherlands.

"TEAMWORK '76" exercise.

## ELEMENT E

NATO DIRECT DISTRIBUTIONCOMPLETED FILMS, SPECIAL EVENTS AND DAY TO DAYTV DISTRIBUTION (16 MM)

In 1976, thirty-two prints of completed NATO films in their 16 mm format were distributed to networks for TV use. In addition, one hundred and twenty-five TV clips (edited footage), forty-six items from stock footage and three selections from completed films were given to networks for NATO and NATO-related programmes.

NATO assisted in the production of programmes by networks in Belgium, Canada, France, Germany, the Netherlands, Turkey, United Kingdom, United States - and Austria, Switzerland and Bulgaria.

The availability of this material continues to make TV programmes possible in a large number of cases and results in broader exposure of NATO.

THEATRICAL (35 MM) FILM DISTRIBUTION

"Versus" continued to be distributed to theatres in the United States by Modern Talking Picture Service until September, 1976, and "Europe and America" distribution was started in August.

In 1976, "Versus" was shown 9,020 times as a result of 818 bookings and was seen by 1,295,344 spectators. Since the start of this programme in 1973, close to 4,000,000 spectators have seen "Versus" in theatres.

"Europe and America" has been shown 9,126 times as a result of 846 bookings and was seen by 1,004,398 spectators.

DISTRIBUTION IN 35 MM FORMAT AND 16 MM

Distribution of "Atatürk Fifty Years Forward" continued in 1976 in the United Kingdom and British ships at sea, British bases overseas and in Australasia through an agreement with EMI film distributors, at no cost to NATO.

This totals 327 loans in all. In addition, 238 prints were loaned on an indefinite basis to our commercial, non-theatrical distributors.

Thus, 565 prints of NATO films were distributed in 1976.

Of this total, NATO Military and Civilian Agencies received 85 prints, National Military and Civilian Agencies 173, individuals 53 and television stations 37.

At the present time, close to 2,500 prints of NATO films are placed on loan in the member countries.

On Dr Kissinger's visit, nineteen broadcast by seventeen correspondents representing fourteen networks originated from our studios.

In May, through NRK facilities, one hundred and twenty broadcast by networks of eleven countries were originated from the Conference Centre. This amounted to thirty-nine hours' air time.

In December, one hundred and thirty-six broadcast by eighty correspondents representing forty networks originated from our studios.

During DPC and NPG meetings, thirty-eight broadcast by representatives of fourteen networks originated from our studios.

In addition, NATO facilities were used throughout the year to accommodate various networks conducting interviews with the Secretary General and other NATO personalities.

REPORT FROM NATO

This fifteen-minute programme covers various aspects of NATO and NATO-related activities. In 1976, twelve programmes were produced and distributed to sixteen outlets. Some of these outlets re-distribute the programmes in whole or in part.

DISPATCH FROM NATO

This five-minute programme is distributed in the United States and Canada. One hundred and fifty stations are taking it as well as the RKO organization in the United States. Including special "Dispatches", twenty-nine of these programmes were distributed in 1976.

SOUND FACILITIES

The Radio/TV/Films Section maintains all sound and sound recording facilities in the Press Theatre, as well as sound facilities used to provide commentary recordings, sound mixing, etc. for NATO-produced films.

ELEMENT E

MISCELLANEOUS - GENERAL

RECORDING AND PLAY-BACK OF TELEVISION PROGRAMMES AT NATO HQ

A video cassette recorder (VCR), which allows NATIS to copy television programmes received at NATO headquarters and to replay them or to replay copies of programmes received from outside sources, remains a valuable addition to NATO equipment.

Because of this acquisition, twenty-three major programmes were viewed at NATO headquarters by one hundred and eighty-four persons, including the Secretary General, Delegations, high-ranking members of the International Staff and of the International Military Staff.

MILITARY FILM FORUM

The second Military Film Forum was organized by NATIS in November, 1976, and was attended by twenty-five representatives from ten countries of the Alliance.

In 1976, distribution and target audiences was the major topic on the agenda; but all aspects of film production were discussed as well as distribution.

A concrete example of production co-operation, as a result of the first Forum held in 1975, is the film "The Teamworkers" which was produced by NATIS with the assistance of camera crews and technicians from eight NATO nations.

These meetings have been found so useful that it was agreed similar meetings should be held every year instead of every two years as originally envisaged, and the title was changed to "NATO Military Audio-Visual Working Group". This title has been approved by the MODIOs under CM(76)79.

ELEMENT F

PHOTOS, DISPLAYS AND VISUAL AIDS

I. DISPLAYS

In 1976, the main exhibition effort was concentrated in the United Kingdom.

The background for activities in the UK was the International Air Tattoo 76 in aid of the Royal Air Force Benevolent Fund. A large NATO exhibition - 20 panels - was sent to England at the beginning of June. Before the exhibition was shown at the International Air Tattoo (Greenham Common, Newbury) it was also presented at the Open Day arrangement in RAF Mildenhall, Suffolk. More than 30,000 attended the Open Day. A much bigger crowd came to the Air Tattoo.

Another special display event was a NATO-STANAVFORLANT/STANAVFORCHAN exhibition, shown at the keyside in Ghent in connection with the first visit to Ghent of STANAVFORLANT/CHAN. The display was seen by a large number of people, including many school children on conducted tours. NATO films were shown and NATO publications handed out.

## II. VISUAL AIDS

In the visual aid field the production of NATO ball point pens, lighters, cufflinks, and NATO ash trays continued. Sixteen sets of NATO flags were produced. Work was continued to update the NATO Briefing Slide Set, to be ready during the first months of 1977.

## III. PHOTO COVERAGES

As usual the Photo Office carried out a number of photo coverages, the most important being the Spring Ministerial Meeting in Oslo and the December Meeting in Brussels. The total number of photo missions was 25, including coverages

of Atlas Express Exercise in Norway, STANAVFORLANT manoeuvres in the North Sea, Reforger Exercise (in Texas, Belgium and Germany), AMF Exercise in Sardinia and Bonded Item Exercise in Denmark.

More than 12,000 photos, most of them black and white, were handed out to the press during the year.
