SUB-COMMITTEE ON SOVIET ECONOMIC POLICY

Meeting held at the Permanent Headquarters, Paris XVIe., on Friday, 2nd July, 1965, at 10.15 a.m.

DECISION SHEET

- I. <u>ECONOMIC REVIEW OF INDIVIDUAL EASTERN EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:</u> <u>BULGARIA</u>
 - The SUB-COMMITTEE:
 - (1) had an exchange of views on the present economic situation in Bulgaria, that country's foreign trade relations and prospects for the future; the discussion was introduced by Dr. Czybulka (Germany) and Mr. Volze (Germany), Mr. Fouchet (France) and Mr. Tice (United States) participated;
 - (2) noted that the German Delegation would circulate, as a supplement to its draft note on Bulgaria (AC/89-WP/164), a report on Bulgarian energy capacities;
 - (3) agreed to prepare the following papers on Bulgaria
 - (i) a draft summary report for the consideration of the Committee of Economic Advisers which might decide to submit it to the Council;
 - (ii) a detailed record of the discussion to be checked by the participants for their information;
 - (iii) a consolidated draft report on the Bulgarian economy and prospects for the future as a reference document.

II. ECONOMIC REVIEW OF INDIVIDUAL EASTERN EUROPEAN COUNTRIES: ALBANIA

The SUB-COMMITTEE:

agreed, at the suggestion of the Italian Authorities which had drawn up a study on the economic situation in Albania, to defer its examining session until early September. -2-

III. PRICES AND STRUCTURE OF SOVIET FOREIGN TRADE

The SUB-COMMITTEE:

- (1) had an exchange of views on this subject using the German Delegation's note AC/89-WP/153 and the United Kingdom Delegation's comments thereon (AC/89-WP/153/1) as a basis for discussion;
- (2) noted that the German Delegation would circulate additional comparative statistics and that a further study based on the 1964 Soviet foreign trade statistics would be carried out when these statistics were **published**;
- (3) noted that the Chairman's suggestion that it might be of value to make a similar study for the years prior to 1963.

IV. BALANCE OF PAYMENTS OF THE EASTERN EUROPEAN COUNTRIES

The SUB-COMMITTEE:

noted that the Economics Directorate would, within the limits of its possibilities, draw up a paper on the balance of payments position of the Eastern European countries, as suggested by the United States Delegation; in order to accomplish this task, the International Secretariat would be grateful to be provided with as much information as national authorities could make available on this subject.
