STATEMENT BY TITO ON THE MOVEMENT OF PEOPLE I.

The COMMITTEE:

took note of the contribution by the Canadian Representative concerning the remarks made by President Tito on his return from Germany regarding the movement of people between Yugoslavia and the Federal Republic of Germany.

SOVIET MILITARY PRESENCE IN RUMANIA

The COMMITTEE:

took note of statements by the German, Italian and Netherlands Representatives to the effect that their respective diplomatic missions in Bucharest had heard rumours suggesting that the Soviet Military Authorities were making representations - so far without success - aimed at obtaining "temporary" authorization to use a corridor across Rumanian territory for the transit of military personnel and equipment en route for Bulgaria.

- took note of a contribution by the International (1)Military Staff to the analysis of the possible duplications of the Indian nuclear explosion; further noted that, subject to the agreement of its author, this contribution would be circulated to the members of the Committee;
- took note of the comments made during the meeting (2)by the Canadian and Italian Representatives concerning the above-mentioned draft report;
- (3)agreed to continue its discussion at the next meeting.

The COMMITTEE:

noted that none of the delegations had objected in principle to the proposal that the Committee, perhaps with the participation of experts should hold prior consultations on the 29th United Nations General Assembly at NATO Headquarters on 3rd September, 1974; also noted that the Italian, United Kingdom, Norwegian and Netherlands Delegations could already agree to the suggested date.

VI. CONFIDENCE-BUILDING MEASURES

The COMMITTEE:

took note of a statement by the Canadian Representative to the effect that his Authorities did not favour the adoption of a proposal put forward at the last meeting by the Belgian Representative, the effect of which would be to broaden the context of the CBM negotiations.
