Note by the Norwegian Delegation

three year trade agreement between Norway and Bulgaria(1) was signed in Sofia on 16th October, 1962. agreement will become effective on 1st January, 1963. same time commodity lists for the year 1963(1) were agreed upon, The trade protocol currently in force was extended until lat January, 1963. A Norwegian proposal lat November, 1962, all payments be made it was accepted by the Bulgarian delegation. A Norwegian proposal that after 1st November, 1962, all payments be made in convertible currency As this is expected of to stimulate trade between the two countries, the parties agreed to increase the present quotas of N.kr. 7 million each way. The established commodity lists for 1965 anticipate Norwegian exports of for about N.kr. 13 million and Bulgarian exports for over M.kr. 12 million.

The main Norwegian export items are salted and frozen herring and fish (£250,000), paper (£300,000), mechanical wood pulp and cellulose (£150,000) and egg trays (£150,000). New quotas were also established for ferrous and non-ferrous metals (£200,000) and for machinery and equipment (£200,000).

Norway's imports from Bulgaria will, as before, consimainly of agricultural products like grapes and other fruits, maize, tomataes and other vegetables.
