

## Corrigendum to Document AC/127-D/204(Revised) dated 8th December, 1965

The member country whose data on the new credits granted to communist countries during the first half of 1965 had not reached the International Secretariat early enough to be included in the twelfth report on credits granted by member countries to communist countries, has now furnished this information. In consequence, the following amendments should be made to the twelfth report:

- (a) Paragraph 1: delete third sentence and the words
  "In addition" at the beginning of the fourth sentence.
- (b) Replace paragraph 10 by the following and delete footnote (1) on page 5:
  - "10. New outstanding credits granted by member countries during the first half of 1965 are indicated in Table V. Private guaranteed credits granted during this period (\$372.9 million) represent 23.7% of the total credits in this category outstanding on 30th June 1965(the percentage on 31st December 1964 was 35.8%). Data on new outstanding credits have also made it possible to calculate the value of the reimbursements by communist countries of private guaranteed credits received by them. Such reimbursements amounted to \$192.3 million for the first half Whereas during the second helf of 1964 the of 1965. Soviet Union took the largest share of the new private guaranteed credits (43%), during the first half of 1965 its share was only equal to 4.3%. Indeed, du Indeed, during the latter period, the bulk of the new outstanding credits went to the Eastern European countries. in particular to the Soviet-occupied Sone of Germany, Bulgaria and Rumania,"
- (c) Replace Table V by the new table attached here to.
